# **School Development Plan – Actions**

## **Learning Excellence Actions**

- Explicit teaching of fluency strategies in math and reading
- Use of examples and nonexamples of accuracy, automaticity, and fluency in reading
- Implement daily high yield math routines focused on building efficiency, flexibility, and accuracy
- Ongoing and actionable feedback





# **School Development Plan – Actions**

## **Well-Being Actions**

- Build resilience and self-awareness through goal setting (explicit teaching of goal setting protocols)
- Clear and consistent routines and protocols for fluency in math and reading
- Create a culture that values the thinking process and strategies over speed and algorithms in math





# **School Development Plan – Actions**

# Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions

- Making explicit connections between the curriculum and Indigenous perspectives
- Considering relevancy and representation when selecting texts
- Intentional focus on improving attendance using a holistic school-wide approach





# **School Development Plan – Actions**

### **Professional Learning**

- Collaborative Professional Learning (shared with 2 other schools) focused on literacy, math and well-being
- System-Wide New Curriculum Professional Learning Series
- Books Studies
- School-Based Processes such as Collaborative Response Meetings, Calibration, and Common School-Wide Routines & Vocabulary

- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.




